# HOUSE BILL 2206

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE ARIZONA STATE LIBRARY, ARCHIVES AND PUBLIC RECORDS FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE DEVELOPMENT.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Legislative intent; findings

3 It is the intent of the legislature to protect Arizona's resources and,  
4 at the same time, to invest in Arizona's museums so that they will help  
5 expand Arizona's economy. Many recent studies note that a strong cultural  
6 and educational infrastructure is vital to a community's economic  
7 development. In Arizona, museums have positioned themselves to take  
8 advantage of the growing and lucrative cultural heritage tourism industry.  
9 This joint effort between the Arizona state library, archives and public  
10 records and the Arizona humanities council, the two primary agencies that  
11 work with libraries and museums statewide, will provide the training and  
12 resources to enable more libraries and museums to participate in this  
13 economic development initiative.

14 Sec. 2. Appropriation; purpose; exemption

15 A. The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from the state general fund in  
16 fiscal year 2001-2002 to the Arizona state library, archives and public  
17 records for the following purposes in the following amounts in accordance  
18 with procedures established by the director of the Arizona state library,  
19 archives and public records, in cooperation with the Arizona humanities  
20 council:

21 1. \$50,000 for the purposes of funding three separate workshops  
22 devoted to staff development in cultural heritage tourism. Specifically, one  
23 workshop shall be devoted to marketing, one workshop for understanding  
24 cultural attractions and one workshop for collaboration between the cultural  
25 community and the tourism industry.

26 2. \$425,000 for museum product design and development of educational  
27 cultural tourism heritage, including up to \$5,000 for planning grants,  
28 general grants of \$10,000 to \$50,000 for implementation and one capstone  
29 grant of \$100,000 for an exemplary project.

30 3. \$25,000 for administrative expenses, including one staff position  
31 each for the Arizona state library, archives and public records and the  
32 Arizona humanities council, office expenses, proposal review, travel and  
33 outside evaluators.

34 B. The appropriation made in subsection A of this section is exempt  
35 from the provisions of section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to  
36 lapsing of appropriations.
