AN ACT

AMENDING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 1, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 15-103; RELATING TO EDUCATION.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 15, chapter 1, article 1, Arizona Revised Statutes,
3 is amended by adding section 15-103, to read:

4 15-103. Participation in no child left behind act; prohibition

5 THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, THE
6 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, THE STATE BOARD FOR CHARTER SCHOOLS,
7 THE ARIZONA STATE SCHOOLS FOR THE DEAF AND THE BLIND, THE STATE EDUCATIONAL
8 SYSTEM FOR COMMITTED YOUTH, THE SCHOOL FACILITIES BOARD, SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND
9 CHARTER SCHOOLS MAY NOT ENTER INTO CONTRACTS OR OTHER AGREEMENTS PURSUANT TO
10 THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001 (P.L. 107-110) OR OTHERWISE PARTICIPATE
11 IN THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.

12 Sec. 2. Retroactivity

13 This act is effective retroactively to from and after June 30, 2004.
