**AMENDING SECTION 5-321, 5-321.01, 5-322, 5-323, 5-383, 17-332, 17-333, 17-345, 17-346 AND 17-371, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT.**

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
 2 Section 1. Section 5-321, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
 3 read:

4 ~~5-321. Numbering; registration fees; exemption from taxation;~~  
 5 ~~repeal of registration; penalty; procedures~~

6 A. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 5-322, the owner of each motorized  
 7 watercraft requiring numbering by this state shall file an application for a  
 8 registration number with the department, or its agent, on forms approved by  
 9 the department. Except as provided by rule adopted by the commission, the  
 10 application shall be signed by the owner of the motorized watercraft and  
 11 shall be accompanied by a registration fee ~~and a license tax~~ levied at the  
 12 following rates:

13 1. For a resident owner, defined as a person who owns a boat for which  
 14 registration is required and who is required to and does register motor  
 15 vehicles owned by the person in this state or, if no motor vehicle is owned  
 16 by the person owning the boat, the person is a resident as defined by section  
 17 28-2001, a registration fee ~~of four dollars and a license tax of forty-five~~  
 18 ~~cents per foot of length or fraction thereof of each watercraft up to and~~  
 19 ~~including eighteen feet and sixty-eight cents per foot of length for each~~  
 20 ~~foot or fraction thereof over eighteen feet except as provided in section~~  
 21 ~~5-322.~~ AS FOLLOWS:

43 B. PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IX, SECTION 16, CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA,  
 44 WATERCRAFT ARE EXEMPT FROM AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX AND FROM LICENSE TAXES IN  
 45 LIEU OF PROPERTY TAX.

1           ~~B.~~ C. The length of the motorized watercraft shall be measured from  
2 the most forward part of the bow excluding the bowsprit or jibboom, over the  
3 centerline to the rearmost part of the transom excluding sheer, outboard  
4 motor, rudder, handles or other attachments. Upon receipt of the application  
5 in approved form, the department or its agent shall enter the application on  
6 the records of its office and issue to the applicant two current annual  
7 decals and a certificate of number stating the number issued to the  
8 watercraft and the name and address of the owner. The owner shall display  
9 the assigned number and the current annual decals in such manner as may be  
10 prescribed by rules of the commission. The number and decals shall be  
11 maintained in legible condition. The certificate of number or commission  
12 approved proof of valid certificate of number, except as provided in section  
13 5-371, shall be available at all times for inspection by a peace officer  
14 whenever the watercraft is in operation. No number issued by another state  
15 or the United States coast guard, unless granted exemption or exception  
16 pursuant to this chapter, shall be displayed on the watercraft.

17           ~~C.~~ D. No motorized watercraft shall be purchased, sold or otherwise  
18 transferred without assignment by the owner of the current numbering  
19 certificate or other documentation as may be prescribed by rules of the  
20 commission. Within fifteen days after such transfer, the person to whom such  
21 transfer is made shall make application to the department to have the  
22 motorized watercraft registered in the person's name by the department, for  
23 which the department shall charge a transfer fee of four dollars. The  
24 department shall not issue or transfer a numbering certificate for a  
25 motorized watercraft to a person who is subject to the use tax under title  
26 42, chapter 5, article 4 unless the applicable tax has been paid as shown by  
27 a receipt from the collecting officer. Persons doing business as marine  
28 dealers and licensed as such by this state are not required to register in  
29 their name any watercraft in their possession that may be offered for resale.

30           ~~D.~~ E. In the event of the loss or destruction of the certificate of  
31 number or annual decal, the department shall issue a duplicate to the owner  
32 upon payment of a fee of two dollars.

33           ~~E.~~ F. The department may issue any certificate of number directly or  
34 may authorize any person to act as agent for the issuance of the certificate  
35 of number in conformity with this chapter and with any rules of the  
36 commission. An agent that contracts with the commission to renew  
37 certificates of number by telecommunication may impose additional fees for  
38 ~~their~~ THE services as provided in the contract.

39           ~~F.~~ G. The owner shall furnish to the department notice of the  
40 transfer of all or any part of the owner's interest other than the creation  
41 of a security interest in a motorized watercraft numbered in this state  
42 pursuant to the provisions of this chapter or of the destruction or  
43 abandonment of such watercraft within fifteen days. Such transfer,  
44 destruction or abandonment shall terminate the certificate of number of such  
45 watercraft, except that in the case of a transfer of a part interest which

1 does not affect the owner's right to operate such watercraft, the transfer  
2 shall not terminate the certificate of number.

3 ~~G.~~ H. Any holder of a certificate of number shall notify the  
4 department within fifteen days if the holder's address no longer conforms to  
5 the address appearing on the certificate and shall, as a part of such  
6 notification, furnish the department with the holder's new address. The  
7 commission may provide in its rules for the surrender of the certificate  
8 bearing the former address and its replacement with a certificate bearing the  
9 new address or the alteration of an outstanding certificate to show the new  
10 address of the holder.

11 ~~H.~~ I. On renewal of any motorized watercraft registration that has  
12 not been renewed by the current expiration date, the department shall assess  
13 a penalty unless the watercraft ownership has been transferred and the  
14 watercraft was not registered subsequent to the expiration date. The  
15 commission shall establish the penalty which shall not exceed fifteen  
16 dollars. If more than twelve months have lapsed since the expiration date of  
17 the last registration or renewal the penalty and back fees are waived.

18 Sec. 2. Section 5-321.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
19 read:

20 5-321.01. Staggered watercraft registration; rules

21 A. The commission shall establish a system of staggered registration  
22 on a monthly basis in order to distribute the work of registering watercraft  
23 as uniformly as practicable throughout the twelve months of the calendar  
24 year.

25 B. All watercraft registrations provided for in this article expire in  
26 accordance with the schedules established by the commission. The commission  
27 may set the number of renewal periods within a month from one each month to  
28 one each day depending on which system is most economical and best  
29 accommodates the public.

30 C. The commission, in order to initiate the staggered registration  
31 system, may register a watercraft for a period of greater or less than twelve  
32 months up to a period of eighteen months. If a registration period is set  
33 for a period other than twelve months the commission may prorate the  
34 registration fee ~~and license tax~~.

35 D. The commission shall ~~promulgate~~ ADOPT rules necessary to accomplish  
36 the purposes of this section.

37 Sec. 3. Section 5-322, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

38 5-322. Motorized watercraft to be numbered; exemptions;  
39 exceptions

40 A. All undocumented motorized watercraft whether underway, moored or  
41 anchored on the waters within the boundaries of the state shall be numbered  
42 in accordance with this chapter or rules of the commission in accordance with  
43 the federally approved numbering system except:

1 1. Foreign watercraft temporarily using the waters of the state.  
2 2. Military or public vessels of the United States, except  
3 recreational type public vessels.

4 3. Watercraft used solely as ~~life boats~~ LIFEBOATS.

5 4. Undocumented watercraft operating under a valid temporary  
6 certificate issued pursuant to rules adopted by the commission.

7 B. Motorized watercraft owned and operated exclusively by the state or  
8 by any political subdivision of the state shall be numbered, but no ~~tax or~~  
9 registration fee shall be paid on the watercraft.

10 C. All nonresident owners of motorized watercraft when in the course  
11 of interstate operation displaying a current and valid number issued under an  
12 approved federal numbering system of the United States coast guard, a state,  
13 the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam or the District of  
14 Columbia shall register such watercraft with the department prior to the  
15 expiration of the reciprocity period prescribed by rules of the commission.

16 D. All nonresident-owned motorized watercraft, when in the course of  
17 interstate operation and not required to be numbered in their state of  
18 principal use, shall comply with the requirements of subsection C of this  
19 section.

20 E. Except as provided in subsection F of this section, any person who  
21 is a resident of this state and WHO is the owner of a motorized watercraft  
22 shall number the watercraft pursuant to section 5-321 prior to operating such  
23 watercraft on the waterways of the state.

24 F. When this state becomes the new state of principal use of a  
25 motorized watercraft displaying a current number issued under a federally  
26 approved numbering system, the validity of such number shall be recognized  
27 for a period of ninety days. Upon expiration of the ninety-day period and  
28 prior to any subsequent use, the owner shall number any motorized watercraft  
29 pursuant to section 5-321.

30 G. Each dealer or manufacturer in this state engaged in the sale of  
31 motorized watercraft using the watercraft for demonstration shall obtain one  
32 or more dealer watercraft certificates of number with the current validating  
33 decals. Applications, renewal and display of certificates of number shall be  
34 as prescribed in this chapter or by rules of the commission, except that the  
35 annual fee will be two dollars fifty cents for each certificate of number and  
36 accompanying current decals.

37 ~~H. Owners of commercial motorized watercraft not exempted from the ad  
38 valorem property taxes under article IX, section 16, Constitution of Arizona,  
39 are exempt from the lieu tax requirements of section 5-321.~~

40 Sec. 4. Section 5-323, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

41 5-323. Disposition of fees

42 ~~A.~~ EACH MONTH MONIES RECEIVED FROM the registration fees received  
43 under this chapter for the numbering of watercraft shall be deposited,  
44 pursuant to sections 35-146 and 35-147, AS FOLLOWS:

45 1. SIXTY-FIVE PER CENT SHALL BE DEPOSITED in a special fund to be  
46 known as the watercraft licensing fund. Such fund is to be used by the

1 department for administering and enforcing ~~the provisions of~~ this chapter and  
2 providing an information and education program relating to boating and  
3 boating safety. THESE MONIES ARE SUBJECT TO LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION.

4 ~~B. Each month monies received from the license taxes imposed under~~  
5 ~~section 5-321 in the amount of forty five per cent of such revenues shall be~~  
6 ~~transferred to the watercraft licensing fund. Such monies are subject to~~  
7 ~~legislative appropriation.~~

8 ~~C. 2. Each month monies received from the license taxes imposed under~~

16 Sec. 5. Section 17-332, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

17 ~~17-332.~~ Form and contents of license; duplicate licenses;  
18 period of validity

19 A. Licenses and license materials shall be prepared by the department  
20 and furnished and charged to dealers authorized to issue licenses. The  
21 license shall be issued in the name of the department and countersigned by an  
22 issuing dealer. Except as provided by rule adopted by the commission, each  
23 license shall be signed by the licensee in ink on the face of the license and  
24 any license not signed is invalid. With each license authorizing the taking  
25 of big game the department shall provide such tags as the commission may  
26 prescribe, which the licensee shall attach to the big game animal in such  
27 manner as prescribed by the commission.

28 B. The commission shall issue with each license a shipping permit  
29 entitling the holder of the license to a shipment of game or fish as provided  
30 by article 4 of this chapter.

31 C. It is unlawful, except as provided by the commission, for any  
32 person to apply for or obtain in any one license year more than one original  
33 license permitting the taking of big game. A duplicate license or tag may be  
34 issued by the department or by a license dealer if the person requesting such  
35 license or tag furnishes the information deemed necessary by the  
36 commission. A fee of ~~three~~ FOUR dollars shall be collected for each  
37 duplicate license or tag issued.

38 D. No license or permit is transferable, nor shall such license or  
39 permit be used by anyone except the person to whom such license or permit was  
40 issued, except that a parent or legal guardian may allow the parent's or  
41 guardian's minor child to use the parent's or guardian's big game permit or  
42 tag to take big game pursuant to the following requirements:

43 1. The parent or guardian must transfer the permit or tag to the child  
44 in a manner prescribed by the commission.

45 2. The parent or guardian must accompany the child in the field and  
46 must be within fifty yards of the child when the animal is taken.

1           3. The child must possess a class F or class G license and, if under  
2 the age of fourteen, must satisfactorily complete the Arizona hunter  
3 education course or another comparable hunter education course that is  
4 approved by the director.

5           4. Any big game that is taken counts toward the child's bag limit.

6           E. No refunds may be made for the purchase of a license or permit.

7           F. Licenses are valid for a license year and expire on December 31  
8 except for special licenses issued by the commission, pioneer complimentary  
9 licenses, resident and nonresident trapping licenses, sport falconry licenses  
10 and classes B, C and D licenses as provided in section 17-333 and lifetime  
11 class A, F and G licenses and lifetime trout stamps as provided in section  
12 17-335.01. Trapping licenses are valid from July 1 through June 30 of the  
13 following year. Lifetime licenses and lifetime trout stamps are valid for  
14 the lifetime of the licensee.

15           Sec. 6. Section 17-333, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:  
16 17-333. Licenses; classes; fees; definition

17           A. Licenses shall be divided into classes and maximum fees to be paid  
18 for such licenses are as follows:

19           1. Class A, general fishing license, valid for the taking of all  
20 aquatic wildlife, except trout statewide, and aquatic wildlife from  
21 commission designated urban waters, resident, ~~sixteen~~ TWENTY-FIVE dollars;  
22 nonresident, ~~forty-nine~~ EIGHTY-FIVE dollars ~~fifty-cents~~, except that the  
23 maximum fee for a class A license issued in November or December is one-half  
24 of the fee otherwise prescribed by this paragraph.

25           2. Trout stamp, validates general and lifetime class A licenses for  
26 the taking of trout, resident, ~~ten~~ FIFTEEN dollars ~~fifty-cents~~; nonresident,  
27 ~~forty-nine~~ SIXTY dollars ~~fifty-cents~~. The stamp is valid for a license year  
28 and expires on December 31, whether it validates a general or lifetime  
29 license.

1           7. Class E, Colorado river fishing license, valid for the taking of  
2 all aquatic wildlife, nonresident, ~~forty-two~~ FIFTY-FIVE dollars ~~fifty cents~~.

3           8. Class F, combination general hunting and fishing license, valid for  
4 the taking of all aquatic wildlife except from commission designated urban  
5 waters, small game, fur-bearing animals, predatory animals, nongame animals,  
6 nongame birds, upland game birds and migratory game birds, except ducks,  
7 geese and swans, resident, ~~forty-two~~ SIXTY dollars; nonresident, ~~one~~ TWO  
8 hundred ~~seventy-five~~ SEVENTY dollars ~~fifty cents~~.

9           9. Urban fishing license, valid for taking all aquatic wildlife from  
10 commission designated urban waters, residents and nonresidents, ~~sixteen~~

12 include the right to fish in all commission designated urban waters.

13           10. Class G, general hunting license, valid for the taking of small  
14 game, fur-bearing animals, predatory animals, nongame animals, nongame birds,  
15 upland game birds and migratory game birds, except ducks, geese and swans,  
16 resident, ~~twenty-three~~ THIRTY-FIVE dollars ~~fifty cents~~; nonresident, one

18           11. Class H, three-day hunting license, valid for the taking of small  
19 game, fur-bearing animals, predatory animals, nongame animals, nongame birds,

22           12. Class I, resident family fishing licenses, valid for taking all

25 household. ~~For purposes of this paragraph, "immediate family" means one~~  
26 ~~adult, or two adults who are married to each other, and their minor children,~~  
27 ~~if any, who will be at least fourteen years of age during the license year,~~  
28 ~~including adoptive children, stepchildren, foster children and other children~~

11 WATERS, SMALL GAME, FUR-BEARING ANIMALS, PREDATORY ANIMALS, NONGAME ANIMALS,

35 WILDLIFE FROM COMMISSION DESIGNATED URBAN WATERS, SMALL GAME, FUR-BEARING
